Brown's practice, paired with a deep concern for the environmental changes that humanity is bringing to the planet, has created the desire for locally focused retail that both celebrates the wonderful objects produced by the people of the Chicago and Midwest region, as well as a commitment to a sustainable lifestyle for

customers. Brown received her BA from the Gallatin School at New York University in 2009 and her MFA from the University of Illinois at Chicago in 2019.
