We set priorities for the residency and the organization and shared hopes and dreams for the future.









Data Insights >

More than **2,500** individuals have responded to the Chicago Arts Census, yielding **tens of thousands** of quantitative data points and more than **6,000** qualitative responses that participants granted permission to share.

Data Synthesizing The Chicago Arts Census team has devoted 2023 to reading, coding, and synthesizing thousands of responses to get to a point of deeper understanding about the complexities and systems at play in Chicago's arts ecosystem.

Accessible Maps and Visualizations Independent data scientist Leonardo Figueiredo joined us in 2023 to help create accessible maps and visualizations in anticipation of making this information available to the public.

Arts Census Phase Two

In late July, we welcomed new Arts Census Program Director Anthony Stepter, who will manage the project through phase two. A revamped Arts Census newsletter was distributed in October as we move toward the reporting phase of the Census project.

We kicked off the summer and our 14th residency season with Summer Daze, featuring music sets, artist vendors, kids activities, and an ACRF Kitchen meal.




